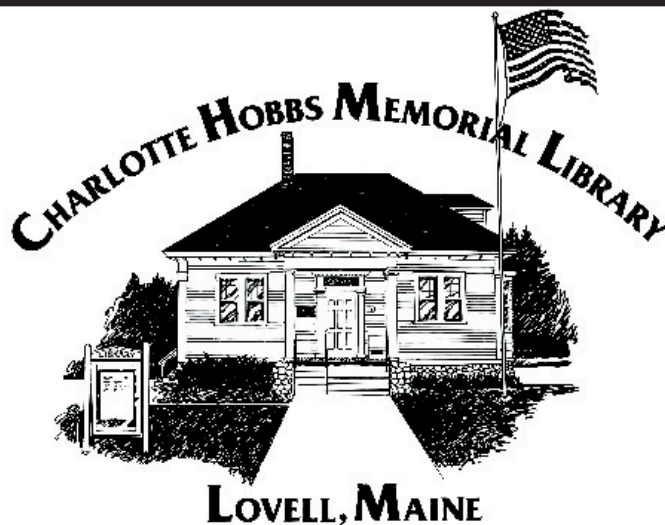

Monthly Speaker Program 'In Search of the Golden Rule' with Virginia Durr Tuesday, January 18 at 7 PM

Virginia Durr, now a Sweden resident, grew up in the South in the heyday of the civil rights struggle. Her family was one of the few white southern families who openly supported social justice and reform for black Americans. Her father, a lawyer, defended Rosa Parks, who was a seamstress for the Durr family. Her mother played a significant role in the abolishment of the poll tax. Her parents and Rosa Parks were Virginia’s inspiration to fight for justice in the mental health system. Virginia wrote a memoir called ‘In Search of the Golden Rule’. On Tuesday January 18, a day after Martin Luther King day, Virginia will share with us parts of her fascinating autobiography.
