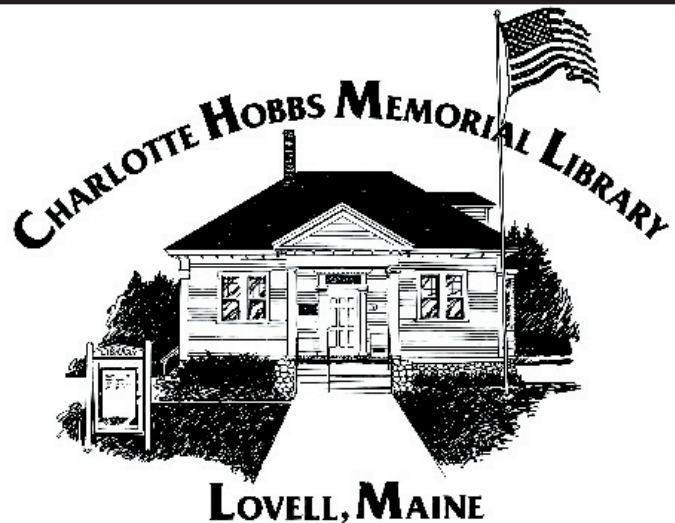

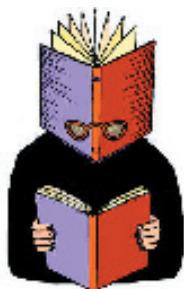

Monthly Speaker Program Herbalist Brenda Gould on Maine's Medicinal Mushrooms on June 14 at 7 PM

Brenda Lynn Gould is an herbalist from West Paris, Maine where she founded "Bear and Bumblebee", a traditional community herbal practice. She teaches at Southwest School of Botanical Medicine in Bisbee, Arizona. Medicinal Mushrooms form a cornerstone of her herbal work. Come light a joyful spark inside your heart for the amazing world of fungi. Mushrooms are not just for gourmet dining. These interesting, often beautiful, frequently unseen and misunderstood creatures touch virtually every aspect of life.

We will examine their work as master recyclers and aids to forest and farm. Some feed roots of trees, beans and other plants and germinate and nourish orchids. When the time comes other fungi keep the forests neat, tidy and uncongested by returning trees back to the soil. In addition, many are used for food, fiber, dye, toys, tinder and medicine. Some of the most powerful medicines on earth come from the Kingdom of the Fungi. Learn how mushrooms found wild in woods and fields of Maine can help support persons facing serious health challenges. These include cancer, immune problems, colds and flus, stress, diabetes, blood pressure, cholesterol, allergies, weight, fatigue, malnutrition and more! Exhibit and handouts provided. All welcome.
