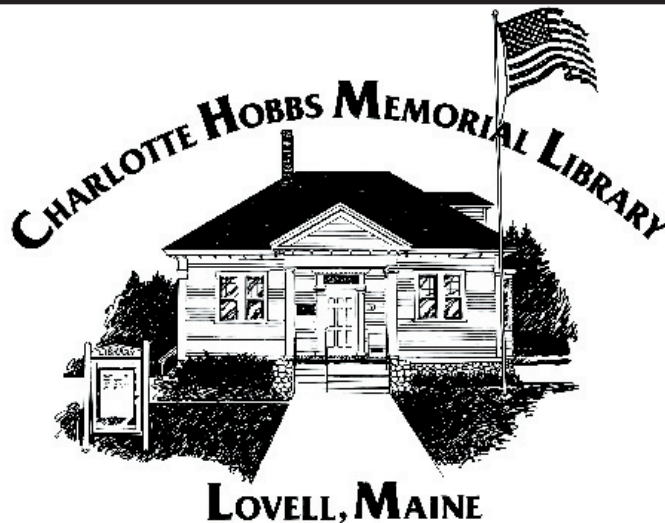

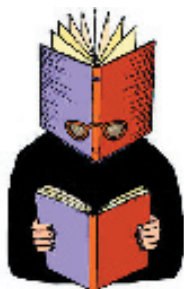

Ken Hamilton, MD

'SoulCircling:

The Journey to the Who'

Tuesday October 11 at 7 PM

Ken Hamilton, MD, is the author of the book 'SoulCircling: The Journey to the Who'. Hamilton has practiced as a surgeon in rural Maine since 1971. He became known as "the physician who listens. His patients taught him about the meaning of life as he talked with them through the painful parts of life that are part of the journey. After a near death experience he came in touch with the human development work of Earl Nightingale. Earl and his colleagues showed him the remarkable power of attitudes to help change and direct our lives. In 1987 he founded H.O.P.E., a non-profit organization in South Paris where people meet to focus on hope and healing. SoulCircling is a process which evolved in Hamilton's support groups to help people uncover their soul and integrate it with the ego. Participants concentrate on the healing power of discovering the spiritual meaning of a person's life. The book is the result of his lifelong interest in healing as a spiritual matter.
